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Inreach Extension Activities 2018 – 19

Report on Pulse polio immunization activity (Academic Year 2018-19)

The Pulse Polio immunization event, a collaborative effort between the NSS Unit of the College and the BMC, exemplified the power of community engagement and public health advocacy. With the dedication of 24 enthusiastic volunteers, the event went beyond merely administering vaccines; it actively reached out to families, guiding parents through the process and ensuring that no child was left unvaccinated. The door-to-door visits served as a powerful reminder, emphasizing the significance of polio immunization, and making healthcare services more accessible.
