Waste Management Policy

Preamble

The Institution has a deep concern to protect the environment, health and well-being through implementation of effective waste management practices such as segregation and supporting recycling. Awakening to control 'throw-away' lifestyles and grow consciousness of generating less waste among students, staff and faculty members has also been adopted. Our NSS students, gardeners and sweepers help in segregation of waste. Awareness programs are also conducted for preventing waste generation and its management.

The institution has two categories of waste namely:-

- · E- Waste
- · Wet and Dry Waste
- · Plastic Waste

To manage these waste, the Waste Management Policies have been framed.

Objectives in the policies are as follows:

- To educate and guide the students and staff members about the disposal of different types of
- · To help the administrative staff to treat the different types of wastes differently.
- · To establish a hygienic and pristine learning atmosphere.



Waste Management Policy

The Policy:

1. E- Waste Management -

An e- waste collection drop box for collecting small size electronic waste has been kept in the main corridor of the college entrance gate. Students and staff deposit used e- waste into it. Institute takes help of agencies for proper disposal of E- waste.

2. Hazardous Waste -

The college does not offer any courses using chemicals and compounds with high intensity of risk and side effects. The college canteen uses stainless steel cups and plates for tea and snacks respectively. Thus avoiding plastics and paper cups. Cigarette smoking is strictly prohibited on college campus.

3. Solid Waste Management -

The administrative supervisor ensures that the waste in each floor is collected at designated time intervals of the waste generated by all sorts of routine activities that includes paper, plastics, glass, metals, foods, etc. On campus, separate trash cans are available for dry garbage. Housekeeping staff employed by the institution collect the waste from different locations, segregate systematically into degradable, non-degradable and finally dispose of it to the Municipality.

4. Wet Waste Management -

For wet and liquid waste management the various liquid wastes generated from canteen and washrooms are drained to the Sewage system. Proper drainage system is arranged for the institution building. The institution has placed a Gobble Bin where the wet waste is collected and eventually converted into compost.

Thus the institution believes in Recycle & Re-Use practices by following the practices:

- 1. Segregate dry and wet waste for easy disposal.
- 2. Segregate plastic waste that can be recycled.
- 3. IT waste to be collected and sent for recycling. Proper record of IT equipment scrapped to be maintained.
- 4. Waste from food products and the canteen to be deposited into the compost pit / Gobble Bin.
